

With the "R" boat races for the Lipton cup starting tomorrow, the mariners hereabout will have a chance to get into the headlines. Ten of the fastest boats in Lake Ontario are entered.

## Racing Yachts Held Back By Storm; Ten Will Start Tomorrow

The 10 swiftest of Lake Ontario "R" boats will slip over the line off the Summerville pier tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock for the first of the races in competition for the cup by Sir Thomas Lipton.

None of the six visiting sloops had arrived at Charlotte this morning, but they are expected in later in the day or during the night. Due to the severe storm of yesterday the yachts were prevented from leaving their home ports on scheduled time, with the exception of the Kathea of Oswego, which left before the storm broke and was forced to put in at Watertown.

On account of yesterday's storm, there is a possibility that the race will be delayed, but the Rochester Yacht Club has sent out word to all ports that power boats will be sent out to tow any of the competing yachts to Charlotte if the skippers desire. If head winds are encountered today, it is expected that some of the yachtsmen will avail themselves of this offer, but no word has yet been received at the club.

In scoring the sloops in the races, a yacht will be given one point for completing the course and one point for each yacht beaten. There will be three races, one tomorrow, one Friday and one on the Fourth

of July. Two of the races will be sailed over a triangular course, three miles to each leg, twice around—a total of 18 miles. The third race will be sailed over a course to windward and return, twice around—a total of 16 miles.

The following yachts are entered: From Rochester, the Rogue, Mybar, M. E. S. and Safara; from Watertown, the Kathea, Huskie II, Nervana; from Oswego, Winona; from Kingston, the Scrapper; from Belleville, the Swamba.
