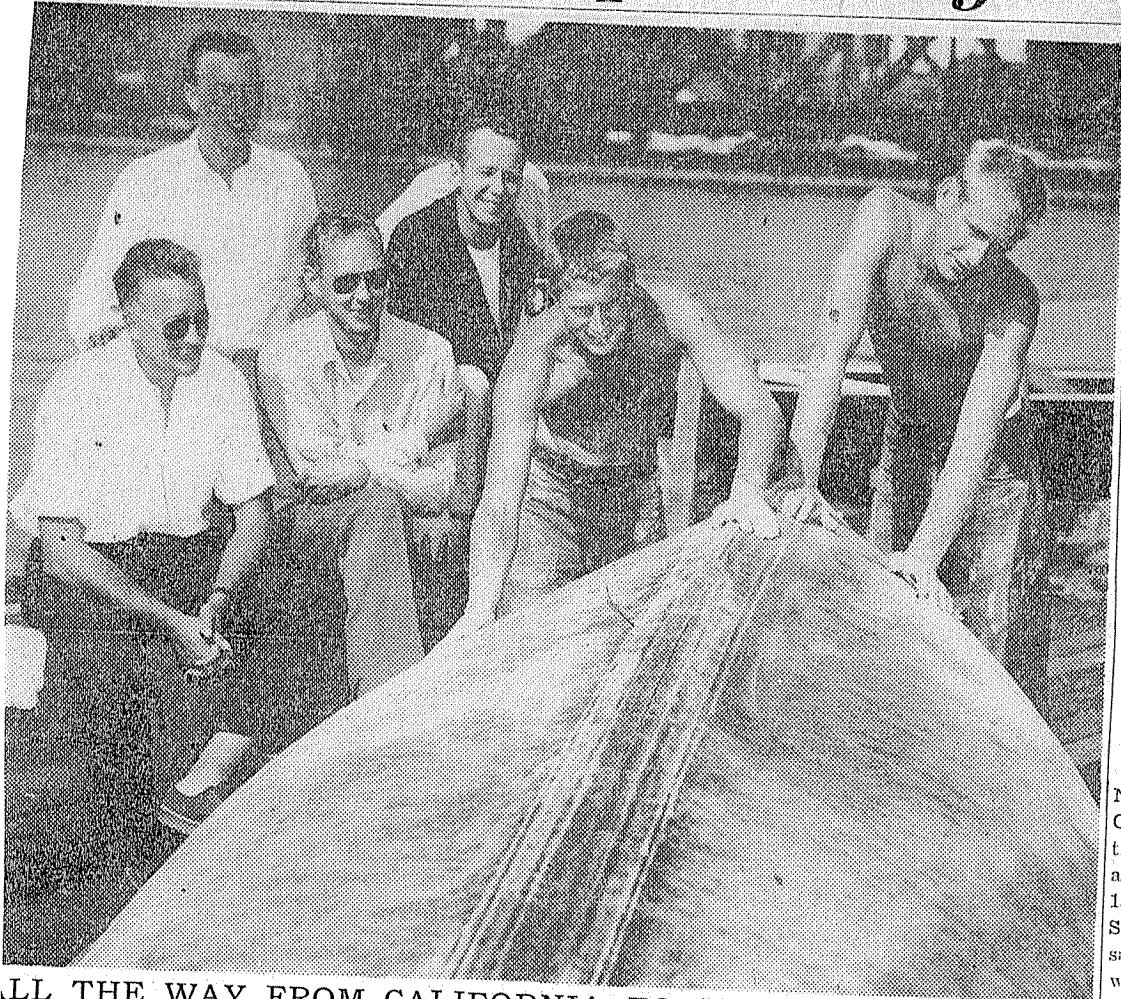


68 Wins Open Playoff

The Dinghies Are Coming—

International 14 Championships Open Tomorrow on Lake Ontario

The Dinghy sailors were arriving in Rochester yesterday for the International 14 Championship Regatta which gets under way at Rochester Yacht Club tomorrow morning.

First to check in were a pair of Pomona College juniors, Robert Schock and Don Zimmerman, who drove from Los Angeles, Calif. with their Dinghy, Baby Grand, trailing along behind. After registering, both were assigned quarters in the Naval Reserve Armory adjacent to the Yacht Club at Summerville. Armory accommodations have been provided by Commander Peter Barry, Naval Reserve commander here.

Dick Fenton, president of the International 14 Association and one of the West Coast's outstanding sailors, also had arrived yesterday. Fenton is president of the California Yachting Association and commodore of the Balboa Yacht Club near Los Angeles. He and his crew, Bill Hamm, brought their Dinghy, Susan.

Also arriving by trailer was Green Dream of Peter Serrell, chairman of the association's fleet development committee and an aeronautical engineer at California Institute of Technology. Serrell and B. P. Lientz Jr. flew in yesterday, to join their crews and boats. Serrell's crew is Don Francis, while Dick Blatterman sails with Lientz. Lientz's boat is Foxy Too, which sailed here in 1942.

Other California boats will be skippered by C. W. Lapworth Jr., yacht designer and chief measurer for the association, who had arrived with Craig Doyle, his crew, and Don Watson, who still was being awaited last night.

Charley Boswell, brother of Bill Boswell, RYC Dinghy sailor, left for New York yesterday morning with a car and trailer to pick up the two Bermuda Dinghies coming to the regatta. The Lil Liza of deForest (Shorty) Trimmingham and the Daphne of Lee Darrell, both of the Royal Bermuda Yacht Club, arrived in New York by ship yesterday morning.

Also already here last night were Bill Daniels and Bob Newbar with their boat from Buffalo Yacht Club; Jack Staples of Evanston, Ill. and his crew, Bob McClain, and Jack Demorest and Jim Grant of Detroit. Royal Canadian Yacht Club sailors from Toronto and

those from the Royal St. Lawrence at Montreal are due today.

More than 45 boats are expected to be drawn up on the Naval Reserve Armory dock tomorrow when the warning gun for the opening race sounds. There will be One-Design racing at 10 a. m. and 3 p. m. tomorrow and at 10 a. m. Thursday, with Open Class races Thursday afternoon and Friday. The dozen Rochester Dinghies entered are all One-Design, with most of the foreign boats entered in the Open Class.
