
# **TROPHIES**

The O'Keefe Trophy will be presented to the first Canadian boat to finish.


The Peck Farley Memorial Trophy will be presented to the first Rochester boat to finish on corrected time.



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## **GENERAL**

# Purpose:

The purpose of the Rochester Race is to encourage the design and building of C.C.A. type yachts suitable for long distance racing and off-shore cruising. The eligibility and safety requirements have been carefully considered and are so included to assure the safety of those sailing off-shore under varying weather conditions.

#### The Course

Starting from a line established off the eastern gap of Toronto around the lighted R-2 buoy approximately 4 miles north of the Niagara River thence north-easterly around Stony Island thence southwesterly to a finish line off the Port of Rochester. Marks may be left to starboard or port. Total distance for the purpose of time calculations to be 218 nautical miles.

## Eliaibility:

The race is open to all yachts that are thoroughly seagoing with enclosed cabins strongly constructed with watertight self-bailing cockpits or flush decks which have a CCA rating of not less than 21.5, and comply with the other conditions of the race as outlined.

#### Management:

The Race will be under the management of the Rochester Race Committee of the Rochester Yacht Club, who shall have full and final authority in interpreting the rules and conditions of the Race. The Committee shall appoint judges to be in charge of the start, duration, and finish of the Race who shall act for and represent the Committee.

The Race Committee reserves the right to reject entries which they consider unseaworthy or unfit to make the voyage; whose equipment is inadequate or unsatisfactory; whose crew is deemed inadequate or insufficiently experienced; or for any other good and sufficient reason.

# Divisions:

The fleet will be divided into two equal divisions. Designations will be made by Aug. 3.

#### **Entries**

Entries close July 31st and must be made on accompanying entry blank. Entry should be accompanied by a copy of your current C.C.A. measurement certificate and a check to cover the \$25.00 entry fee. Entries should be mailed directly to Mr. Frank R. Shumway, Jr., c/o Ritter Corporation, 400 West Ave., Rochester, N. Y. 14603.

## Inspection:

All yacht skippers or their representatives must report to the Inspection Committee with their yachts ready for inspection by Friday, August 6th, 7:00 P.M. A member of the Inspection Committee will be available on August 6th from noon 'til 7:00 P.M. Any yacht failing to report for inspection by this time will not be eligible for the Race. Early inspection may be arranged by contacting Mr. William Cox of the Royal Canadian Yacht Club for boats in the Toronto area or Mr. Frank Shumway of Rochester Yacht Club in the Rochester area.

Yachts shall carry authorized racing numbers according to N.A.Y.R.U.



# THE RACE

#### I. START

Division II will start at 1300 E.D.T. Saturday, August 7th. Division I will start at 1315 E.D.T.

#### II. STARTING LINE

The starting line will be between a buoy with a white flag and the R. C. pennant on the committee boat. The line will be established off the eastern gap of Toronto Harbour.

#### III. SIGNALS

a) Start — All times Eastern Daylight Saving.

b. Postponement—The signal for postponement shall be the ANSWERING PENNANT and such postponement shall be for a period or periods of fifteen (15) minutes duration. The answering pennant will remain flying until lowered five (5) minutes before the warning signal for the start is displayed.

#### c. Recall Signal

A short blast of a sound signal will be given for each yacht over the starting line early as well as a voice hail of the yachts sail number. Other contestants should "pass it along" if necessary.

## IV. FINISH

The finish line will be between the Committee Boat and the end of the eastern pier. The Committee Boat will be distinguished by a white flag in daylight and two white lights one above the other at night. The Committee Boat will be approximately 100 yards north of the light on the eastern pier and should be left to starboard. In the event the Committee Boat cannot remain on station boats should take their own times as they pass within 100 yards of the northern end of the eastern pier. At night boats should identify themselves by shining a light on their sail numbers.



# RULES TO GOVERN

#### I. RACING RULES

The race will be sailed under the IYRU rules as adopted by the N.A.Y.R.U. in 1965, except as modified by this program.

#### II. RULES OF THE ROAD

After 1400 on August 7th the 1960 International Rules of the Road shall replace Part IV of the N.A.Y.R.U. rules.

## III. RUNNING LIGHTS

Running lights shall be displayed by a yacht in compliance with government regulations. Failure to display running lights shall be cause for disqualification.

#### IV. ENGINES

The use of engines for propulsion after preparatory gun is prohibited except for rescue purposes. If engine is required for rescue purposes it will be turned off immediately upon completing the rescue and before resuming course. Such use must be reported to the committee following the race.

### V. ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT

Radar, automatic steering, and similar electronic equipment (except Radio receivers, Direction Finding and sounding equipment) may not be used.

## VI. PROTEST

Oral notice of protest must be made to the Rochester Race Committee within one hour after finishing the race, and be confirmed within twelve hours by written statement to the facts designating the rule or rules violated. The penalty for a foul or premature start if yacht fails to start over, shall be the addition of one hour to the elapsed time of the yacht, unless in the opinion of the committee, the foul is of such serious nature (such as damage to another yacht) to warrant disqualification.

#### VII. CREW

Master and navigator shall be amateurs. Crew shall be sufficient in number and experience to handle the yacht safely under offshore conditions and shall be a minimum of five persons; there is no maximum. ALL MEMBERS OF THE CREW SHALL MAINTAIN STATIONS WITHIN THE LIFELINE.

# VIII. ABANDONMENT OF RACE

Any yacht dropping out of the Race is requested to call the Rochester Yacht Club collect FI 2-5511 promptly so that no needless search will be started for her.
