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


### **WELCOME**

# LAKE YACHT RACING ASSOCIATION

### General Information

- 1. Those participating in the 1966 Long Distance Race from Port Credit to Rochester will have filed, at the time of entering his yacht from his home club, a declaration of equipment. The equipment list will have been certified by his club or by T.D.C.Y.R.A.
- 2. Skippers, or their representatives, shall check into the registration desk at Port Credit Yacht Club to furnish the names of their crews and receive any additional information.
- 3. Skippers who have registered at Port Credit will not have to register again at Rochester Yacht Club if course racing.
- 4. Skippers not participating in the L. D. Race, but wishing to participate in the course racing at Rochester Yacht Club, MUST register at R.Y.C.
- 5. Some boats will be drawn at random for inspection prior to the start of the L. D. Races.
- 6. All boats winning in the L. D. Races shall be inspected. Leave ship unlocked and arrange for inspection after the race.
- 7. ALL REGATTA AND LONG DISTANCE RACE ENTRIES shall be made through the Yacht Club of which the competitor is a member, and entry fees shall be paid by the individual to his own club. Such Yacht Club shall then send one check to the Secretary, Mr. A. H. Gorsline, 330 East Lake Road, Williamson, New York 14589,

to cover all entries from one club. With the entries and check shall be sent the yacht's declaration of equipment and current measurement certificate, unless there is a measurement certificate on file with the L.Y.R.A. or T.D.C.Y.R.A.

- 8. All entries shall be in the hands of the Secretary by Friday, July 15, 1966.
- 9. To operate the Long Distance Race and three days of racing in an efficient manner, all entries must be compiled, handicaps set up, stencils cut and entry lists duplicated. Each year a few Skippers complain about paying a double fee for the late entry. This fee is compulsory, due to the work involved. Entries sent in for one week after July 15 may be accepted only if accompanied by double the usual entry fee.
- 10. Fees charged will be refunded through application to the owner's club if he does not participate in any races.
- ll. Customs and Immigrations Officials will be on hand at both Port Credit Yacht Club and Rochester Yacht Club. In order to avoid any difficulties of former years, please make certain that you contact the officers and obtain the proper papers.
- 12. ALL PARTICIPANTS IN COURSE RACING SHALL CHECK WITH THE REGISTRAR IF THEY HAVE NOT SEEN HIM AT PORT CREDIT. THIS APPLIES TO CENTERBOARDS AS WELL AS KEELBOATS AT R.Y.C.

- 13. All times referred to in the program are Eastern Daylight Saving Time.
- 14. Supplementary instructions may be posted on the Bulletin Board at Rochester Yacht Club. BE CERTAIN TO CHECK THE BOARD EACH MORNING FOR ADDITIONS OR CHANGES.
- 15. The Race Committee shall meet at headquarters at 1800 each day for any business that may come before it.
- 16. The Race Committee requests that all yachts be on the starting line at the proper time and to KEEP CLEAR OF DIVISIONS STARTING AHEAD OF THEM SO THAT THERE WILL BE NO INTERFERENCE. You will be disqualified for interference with classes starting ahead of you.
- 17. The Race Committee will not answer questions on the starting line.
- 18. The Registrar will have the authority, with the consent of the Race Committee, to accept late entries, but only at double the entry fee. Any Skipper laying claim to having paid his entry fee to his club, but not on the record with the Treasurer or the Registrar, may race by paying double the entry fee and having his club give satisfactory evidence that the fee was paid on time, in which case the double fee shall be rebated. July 15 is closing date; see that your club sends entries in on time.

# PRE-RACE ARRANGEMENTS AT PORT CREDIT

The Yacht Club of Port Credit Offers the Following:

- 1. A new Clubhouse at the Yacht Club of Port Credit will be in operation.
- 2. Moorings at the visitor's dock or in the C a n a d a, Steamship basin.
- 3. Parking for cars close by the visitor's dock.
- 4. Clubhouse and moorings within one short block of shopping area; bank, post office, Canadian Customs office, Loblaws for groceries, TV and radio service, etc. Beer and liquor outlets easily reached by one-half mile taxi trip.
- 5. A new six story hotel 'The Newport Hotel' within walking distance to the clubhouse with modern accommodations.
- 6. Gas dock, boat yard and crane across the river from the clubhouse.
- 7. Stores and shops closed Sunday, churches of all denominations within easy walking distance.
- 8. Reception, music and films, Sunday at the Club. Sailors departure dance Monday night.
- 9. Meals at regular hours, snacks until midnight, lounge and bar open from noon to 11:30 p.m. S at urd ay, closed Sunday, Monday open from noon to midnight.
- 10. Information Booth at the Clubhouse.

# LONG DISTANCE RACE INSTRUCTIONS

Tuesday, July 26, 1966

Port Credit to Rochester

- 1. These races are open to all yachts owned by members of clubs belonging to the L.Y.R.A. or C.Y.A. and which are thoroughly seagoing, strongly constructed, and comply with the other conditions of the race as outlined.
- 2. No boat will be recognized as being in the Long Distance Race unless the skipper has registered at Port Credit.
- 3. The 1966 N.A.Y.R.U. rules will govern, except as amended herewith. The 1963, revised for 1965, C.C.A. measurement rule will cover. (All C.C.A. yachts must have been weighed). There will be three divisions of C.C.A. yachts. The divisions will be established at Port Credit Yacht Club by the Race Committee on Monday night, July 25.

#### 4. Courses:

- (a) Course "A" From the starting line off of the Credit River to a Buoy or Judge's Boat carrying a red L.Y.R.A. flag and code flag "M," situated approximately one-quarter of a mile due south of the eastern gap at Toronto. This Buoy shall be left to starboard. From there, to the outernavigation mark, Buoy R-2, approximately four miles north of the Niagara River. This Buoy shall be left to port, and thence to the finish off Rochester.
- (b) Course "B" From the starting line off of the Credit River direct to the Finishline off of Rochester.
- 5. The starting line will be approximately one-half mile in the lake from the mouth of the Credit River. The imaginary line shall be between the Race Committee Boat

carrying the R/C flag and a mark carrying code flag "M." The Buoy will be left to starboard, and the Committee Boat to port.

- 6. Finish The finish line will be between the Committee Boat and the end of the western pier, weather permitting. The Committee Boat will be distinguished by a white flag in daylight and two white lights, one above the other, at night. The Committee Boat will be approximately 100 yards north of the light on the western pier and should be left to port. In the event, the Committee Boat cannot remain on station, a Buoy carrying the code flag "M" will be dropped 100 yards north of the light on the western pier, and boats should finish between that mark and the western pier. At night, as boats come abeam of the light, they should shine a light on their sail numbers.
- 7. Long Distance Races will be sailed under the 1966 N.A.Y.R.U. rules from before the start until 30 minutes after start, after which the 1960 INTERNATIONAL RULES OF THE ROAD shall replace Part IV of the N.A.Y.R.U. rules.
- 8. Running lights shall be displayed by a yacht in compliance with government regulations. Failure to display running lights will mean automatic disqualification.

Coast Guard vessels will report such conditions to the Race Committee.

- 9. Any yacht not properly displaying her racing numbers on sails will not be recognized. Any yacht using numbers other than those she registered under must notify the Race Committee before the start of the race.
- 10. Any yacht dropping out of the race is requested to contact the Race Committee at the Rochester Yacht Club promptly to avoid any needless search. Telephone number FI 2-5511.
- 11. Ship-to-shore radios or ship-to-ship must not be used to better her position.
- 12. There will be a Skipper's briefing meeting at Port Credit Yacht Club at 0930 hours, July 26.
- 13. Protests will be in accordance with N.A.Y.R.U. Procedure, but must be filed on L.Y.R.A. Form. Any yacht committing a foul on the starting line shall, at the discretion of the Race Committee, have time added to her corrected time rather than disqualification. This applies to the L.D. Race only.
- 14. Divisions for C.C.A. or L.O.R. will be furnished at the Skipper's meeting. They cannot be prepared at this time, as we desire to allocate the boats into divisions as equal as possible by number of boats.
- 15. The L.D. Race will be patrolled by the U. S. Coast Guard and the Canadian Coast Guard.

# LAKE YACHT RACING ASSOCIATION SAFETY REGULATIONS

Acted upon by Council Meeting of November 12, 1960

- 1. Must have adequate manual bilge pump, even though they have power pump.
- 2. Must have charts and navigation instructions.
- 3. Compass that is accurate.
- 4. Proper fire extinguisher in compliance with regulations of their respective government Canadian or American.
- 5. Six day or six night flares or twelve railway-type flares in properly protected waterproof wrapping.
- 6. Lead and lead line.
- 7. Two (2) suitable anchors with minimum of 1 5 0 ft. of rope or chain.
- 8. At least one government-approved life jacket for each man aboard two with whistles attached.
- 9. Suitable fog horn.
- 10. Suitable first aid kit.
- ll. One or more suitable life rings near helmsman with automatic flare attached.
- 12. Minimum of three good flashlights one with three inch minimum lens for signalling.
- 13. One 10-quart rigid pail for boats up to 40 feet in length.
- 14. Two 10-quart rigid pails for boats over 40 feet in length.
- 15. Log book and Customs papers.
- 16. Storm canvas or suitable reefing gear.
- 17. Must have weighted pole with fluorescent flag attached, handy to helmsman, to be used in event of man overboard.
- 18. Radar reflector: need not be carried open, but is to be used in case of emergency.
- 19. Small light for each member of the crew, to be worn on clothing when on deck after sunset.

## COURSE RACING INSTRUCTIONS Keel Yachts July 29, 30, 31 Rochester Yacht Club

- 1. Courses will be set up each day, just before the start, from a point approximately 1/2 mile due north of the western pier. Every possible attempt to provide a weather start will be made; however, the starting location will NOT be moved. Should the wind be offshore, a reaching or running start will result.
- 2. The number of the course to be used will be posted on a side of the Committee Boat. A chart of course numbers giving the compass bearings of each leg can be found in another part of this book.
- 3. Open to all Keel Boat Classes belonging to member clubs of L.Y.R.A. and/or C.Y.A.
- 4. Number of Races. ALL DIVISIONS: 3 races. Should one day's races be "washed out" by weather conditions, the results for two races will be accepted. In the event of any division ending in a draw, the "horse-racing" method will be used. Should this leave a tie, a toss of a coin shall decide the winner.
- 5. The 1966 N.A.Y.R.U. Rules will govern. The 1963, revised for 1965, C.C.A. measurement rule will cover.
- 6. PROTESTS: Protests will be in accordance with N.A.Y.R.U. procedure, but must be filed on L.Y.R.A. form. Protests must be filed within two hours after the protesting boat has finished the race. Protesting yachts shall carry White or Red flag in rigging and notify judges of intent. If judges' boat is not notified, at the finishing line, the protest

may not stand. The Protestor shall make certain that the protested boat is informed of intent. Protests shall be heard as soon as conveniently possible after judges' boat has returned to the Rochester Yacht Club.

- 7. STARTING LINE: The starting line shall be between the R/C flag on the Committee Boat and a starting mark flying code flag "M."
- 8. PREMATURE STARTS: Any entry prematurely starting shall be given one long blast of a horn or whistle. The Race Committee shall attempt by hail to notify each offender. However, the onus shall be on the offending entries and not the Race Committee.

#### RECALL:

- A. The hoisting of code flag "Z" shall indicate a single or several premature starters. It will be lowered when all premature starters have returned to the satisfaction of the Race Committee, or 30 seconds before the next starting signal, or, if no further starts are scheduled, at the discretion of the Race Committee.
- B. In the event of there being a number of unidentified premature starters, the Race Committee may make a general recall of the division concerned by firing 2 guns and hoisting the First Repeater Flag (Blue field with yellow triangle superimposed).

A new Preparatory Signal (code Flag "P") shall be hoisted with the firing of the next gun, five minutes after the original starting time. Following a further five minute interval, the division concerned shall be restarted with the hoisting of its starting signal and the firing of a gun. (NOTE: The starts of all succeeding divisions shall be 10 minutes later than their original starting times).

- 9. SHORTENED COURSE: The Race Committee reserves the right to stop the races at any mark if conditions so warrant.
- 10. Any yacht starting late for its division shall report to the Committee Boat, giving its name and number, division and scheduled starting time.
- II. STRICT OBSERVANCE will be maintained by the Race Committee, and yachts will be disqualified for being in starting area before their Five Minute Gun. During the last three years, a few disqualified boats have been disturbed. Make certain that you are not one. Please stay away from the judges' boat while every effort is being made to set the starting line you desire.

#### 12. COURSES:

A. The Large Triangle will be 4-mile legs. The outer marks will be bamboo poles topped with Red flags.

- B. The Small Triangle will be superimposed on the Large Triangle and starting mark with 2 miles per leg. The outer marks for the Small Triangle will be bamboo poles topped with Black and Yellow flags.
- 13. FINISH LINE: The finish line shall be across an imaginary line from the R/C flag on the judges' bo a t and a bamboo pole topped by a Red flag.
- 14. Attention is directed to the rule of the N.A.Y.R.U. wherein masthead burgees and pennants are not to be flown while racing. Failure to observe this rule will result in disqualification. Rule 27.
- 15. Any yacht, using sail numbers other than the ones she registered with on her entry blank, must notify the Race Committee prior to the start of the race... if possible, before the Race Committee leaves the dock at R.Y.C. Numbers on spinnakers must agree with mainsail numbers.
- 16. No boat will be recognized on the starting line unless the owner, or a designated member of the crew, has appeared before the Lt. Registrar, William Garrett, at R.Y.C., and completed the provided Registration Form. Regardless of the entry made by your club and sent in, Skippers MUST also file a Registration Form at R.Y.C. before participating in any race, unless they were in the L.D. races.
- 17. All contestants should watch the notice board at the Rochester Yacht Club for change of times or regrouping of classes.

The judges' boat will not answer questions.

## Centerboard Yachts

July 29, 30, 31

Rochester Yacht Club

- 1. Courses will be set up each day, just before the start, from a point approximately 1/4 mile due east of the eastern pier. Every possible attempt to provide a weather start will be made; however, the starting location will NOT be moved. Should the wind be offshore, a reaching or running start will result.
- 2. The number of the course to be used will be posted on a side of the Committee Boat. A chart of course numbers giving the compass bearings of each leg can be found in another part of this book.
- 3. Open to all centerboard classes belonging to member clubs of L.Y.R.A. and/or C.Y.A.
- 4. Number of Races. ALL DIVISIONS: 3 races. Should one day's race be "washed out" by weather conditions, the results for two races will be accepted. In the event of any division ending in a draw, the "horse-racing" method will be used. Should this still leave a tie, a toss of a coin shall decide the winner.
- 5. The 1966 N.A.Y.R.U. Rules will govern.
- 6. PROTEST: Protests will be in accordance with N.A.Y.R.U. Procedure, but must be filed on L.Y.R.A. form. Protest must be filed within 2 hours after the protesting boat has finished the race. If the judges' boat is not notified, at the finishing line, the protest may not stand. The Protestor shall make certain that

the protested boat is informed of intent. Protests shall be heard as soon as conveniently possible after judges' boat has returned to Rochester Yacht Club. CENTERBOARD YACHTS are exempt from flying a protest flag.

- 7. STARTING LINE: The starting line shall be between the R/C flag on the Committee Boat and a starting mark flying code flag "M."
- 8. PREMATURE STARTS: Any entry prematurely starting shall be given one long blast of a horn or whistle. The Race Committee shall attempt by hail to notify each offender. However, the onus shall be onthe offending entries and not the Race Committee.

### RECALL:

- A. The hoisting of code flag "Z" shall indicate a single or several premature starters. It will be lowered when all premature starters have returned to the satisfaction of the Race Committee, or 30 seconds before the next starting signal, or, if no further starts are scheduled, at the discretion of the Race Committee.
- B. In the event of there being a number of unidentified premature starters, the Race Committee may make a general recall of the division concerned by firing 2 guns and hoisting the First Repeater Flag (Blue field with yellow triangle superimposed).

A new Preparatory Signal (code Flag "P") shall be hoisted with the firing of the next gun, five minutes after the original starting time. 30 SECOND RULE: The Race Committee shall disqualify, without a hearing, any entry or entries whose hull or equipment, wholly or in part, is over the starting line, but not its extensions, 4 minutes 30 seconds after the new Prep-

aratory Signal is made for a restart. Following five minutes after the new Preparatory Signal, the division concerned shall be restarted with the hoisting of its starting signal and the firing of a gun. (NOTE: The starts of all succeeding classes shall be 10 minutes later than their original starting times).

- 9. SHORTENED COURSE: The Race Committee reserves the right to stop the races at any mark if conditions so warrant.
- 10. Any yacht starting late for its division shall report to the Committee Boat, giving its name and number, division and scheduled starting time.
- 11. STRICT OBSERVANCE will be maintained by the Race Committee, and yachts will be disqualified for being in starting area before their Five Minute Gun. During the last three years, a few disqualified boats have been disturbed. Make certain that you are not one. Please stay away from the judges' boat while every effort is being made to set the starting line you desire.
- 12. COURSE: The triangle will be of l-mile legs. The outer marks will be bamboo poles topped with R e d flags.
- 13. FINISH LINE: The finish line shall be across an im-

aginary line from the R/C flag on the judges' b o a t and a bamboo pole topped by a Red flag.

- 14. Any yacht, using sail numbers other than the ones she registered with on her entry blank, must notify the Race Committee prior to the start of the race... if possible, before the Race Committee leaves the dock at R.Y.C. Numbers on spinnakers must agree with mainsail numbers.
- 15. No boat will be recognized on the starting line unless the owner, or a designated member of the crew,h as appeared before the Lt. Registrar, William Garrett, at R.Y.C., and completed the provided Registration Form. Regardless of the entry made by your club and sent in, Skippers MUST also file a Registration Form at R.Y.C. before participating in any race, unless they were in the L.D. races.
- 16. All contestants should watch the notice board at the Rochester Yacht Club for change of times or regrouping of classes.

The judges' boat will not answer questions.

17. STARTING TIMES: At the time we are going to press, it is not known what centerboard classes will be competing in Rochester. Class divisions, starting times and signals will be posted on the bulletin board.
