Acting on the theory that in the springtime a yachtsman's fancy for racing is somewhat more acute than practical, the Star Class fleet of the Rochester Yacht Club already has mapped out its racing schedule for next Summer off Summerville.

Streamlined to fit what the recently deceased 1938 campaign indicated to be the requirements of modern racing yachtsmen, it is radically different than any program previously attempted by a racing group up here.

First, it calls for fewer races; second; it's more flexible, in that skippers can take off a sometimes necessary or desirable occasional weekend or even month, and still stay in the thick of the title competition. This last interest is served by splitting the program up into five series of races. First and second boats in any of these five series will qualify to compete for the season's championship bracket which will come at the end of the campaign, starting Sept. 2.

The finals to decide the season champ and the winner of the new Gannett Trophy will be a sudden death elimination consisting of four races over the Labor Day holiday. The two boats receiving the greatest number of points in the first three races will meet on Monday, Labor Day, to deterdishe missing of the season's laurels.

TIPS FOR STAR SAILORS:

Here are some other forward looking items from the Star Schedule makers:

Any races unsailed because of weather conditions will be simply dropped from the shhedule, except in the eliminations to select World's Championship and 12th District nominees.

No substitution of a skipper shall be allowed except by unanimous consent of all competing skippers in that race and only one substitution of a crew in any one series, except by unanimous consent shall be allowed.

A crew shall have sailed in all of the races in any one series to be eligible to skipper in the Crew Series.

Benefits other than those that are obvious, claimed for the new setup are:

1. It will permit a "late starter" either a late season addition to the fleet or a skipper and crew who for some reason get their boat properly tuned slowly or only late in the season, chance for an equal shot at the title.

2. It will permit entry into the class by "cruising men" who like some competitive sailing, but who wont tie themselves to a class requiring participation every weekend over the entire season.
