Desperate Effort Today By Farley To Make Rogue Even Up

Lowering Skies and Variable Weather Greet Yachts in "R" Class for George Cup in Final Event-Rogue Must Win With Kathea Last To Tie Event—Nayada Is Out of It Completely.

Toronto, July 30 .- Peck Farley will make one last desperate effort to lift the George cup and the "R" class championship of the lake with his Rogue this morning, under lowering skies and a promise of almost anything in the way of weather.

To tie the count for the series Rogue must win, while Kathea, the Watertown yacht, must finish last. As Kathea has so far shown marked superiorty in every kind of weather and on every slant of the wind, there is little hope that the Beorge cup will come to Rochester. Nayada, the Toronto enry, is hopelessly out of it.

Kathea romped away again yeserday over a course that was in-ended to be 3* miles to windward nd return, but was really nothing f the sort. A shift in the wind and ossibly a bit of misjudgment on ne part of the judges made the utward leg'a short hitch and a ing close hauled reach to the uoy. Rogue finished the first ound a few lengths in the lead but st the race almost immediately ereafter.

Ifter rounding the buoy, Farley as off on the starboard tack. athea split with her, keeping on e port tack for some distance. ontrary to expectations, Farley d not follow but stood on out into e lake some distance, then irted the long leg to the buoy. thea came back on the starboard Kathea immediately came out thus shaking the Rochester

That's all there was to it. Kathea nted higher than Rogue and led almost as fast. She con-led to increase her lead to the sh of the race.

The series so far has been aldevoid of smart jockeying rushes between skippers, and nat reason has lacked a little nterest. For the most part ey and Uhlein, the Watertown per, are giving each other e berths, while Addison's ht is not slippery enough for to put up a stiff argument.

The Rogue finished the first round with a 10-second lead, but lost it all and more on the beat to the outer mark. Farley let the Rogue fcot, while Kathea pointed high, and the witch from Watertown seemed to devour distance right into the teeth of the wind. There was no bungling at the outer mark this time and Kathea broke out her spinnaker with not a sec-ond lost. She held well upon the run in while Farley dropped in toward shore, hunting for more

Kathea had Rogue by about two minutes at the outer mark. The race was sailed in a breeze

that never blew more than eight miles an hour. The Rogue did amazingly well on the first round but could not stay with the Water-town boat on the second lap. Farley had his craft working perfectly on the first leg, but, it seemed, he could not get her pointing as well on the final round. The race started under a clear sky and with promise of a perfect day. It finished in a shower that seemed to signify the end of Rochester's George cup hopes.
