

CLUB TO CONSIDER FISHER CUP PLANS

Petition Seeks Olympian's Entry in Trial Race.

Members of the Rochester Yacht Club will consider the question of the club taking over the P Class boat Olympian, and outfitting her for the Fisher Cup trials on an equal basis with the Alloede, at a meeting called for next Saturday. The confab is being called by William Daley in response to a petition presented by several members of the club last week in which such action was advised.

The following petition was presented to Club Manager Volney Lacey by Frank T. Christy, head of the committee advising the action:

A few prominent members of the Rochester Yacht Club are of the opinion that the success of the club's efforts to lift the Fisher Cup largely depends on having at least two properly conditioned Class "P" boats to engage in trial races for the event.

Enrolled in the club are two eligible boats. One, the Alloede, has already been accepted and will be put in racing trim. This selection has been made, undoubtedly, because of the boat's superiority of condition and racing record.

The other, the Olympian, I find by careful investigation is just as worthy of recognition as her past performance has been equal if not superior to her rival, Alloede.

It would cost less than \$1,000 to put her in proper trim, but, unfortunately, her owner has no available funds to meet the outlay. He requests me to offer the boat to the club to be conditioned to meet Alloede. I should be pleased to have you bring this matter before the Board of Directors for early consideration and will, if desired, supply further information.
