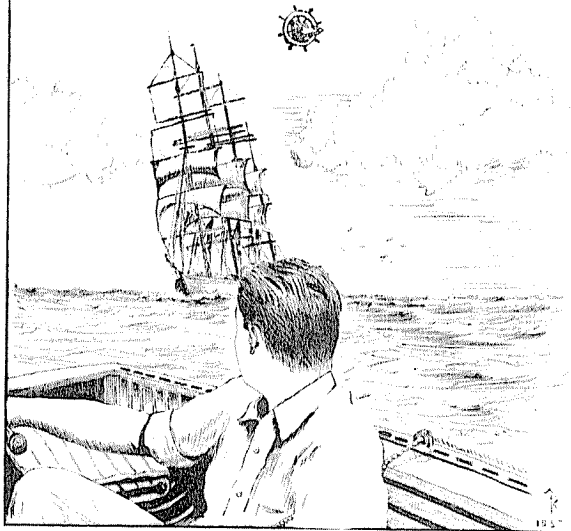

J U S T A W O R D

There is no occasion for a long and extended resume of what has been done by this club, nor is it necessary in this prefatory note to detail the coming events of the season. They will all be found in the schedule. Everything has been carried out in former years according to promise and the Commodore, supported by his committees, proposes to make this season as enjoyable as resources will permit. He has already sounded the keynote in a general letter sent out to all, and it is earnestly hoped that every member having the welfare of the club at heart will lend his support to the end that the organization may be in a much better condition at the close of the season than at the beginning.

This administration realizes that enthusiasm does not run as high in years when there are no races for the Canada's Cup, but it must be remembered that these races entail a great expenditure of money; are the cause of a great deal of hard work on the part of committees and upset the nerves of everyone concerned in them. This same energy and a small part of the financial outlay, expended on the club, would result in more satisfaction and pleasure to our members, and, now, while the Canada's Cup, the biggest sailing trophy on fresh water is stored away in our locker, with no immediate prospect of a challenge winging its way from the Canadian shore, it would seem as though this lull in racing matters would be a good time to strengthen and upbuild the club by the infusion of new blood, new interest, and a livelier enthusiasm, so that when it becomes necessary to defend the the Cup again, the situation will be faced by men eager to take up the battle and carry it out as

cheerfully and successfully as has been done in the past. All honor and praise to the men who for years have worked to build the clubhouse, build the defenders and challengers, men who stood by their principles in spite of criticism. They have overcome every obstacle and won every fight. They are entitled to a rest, and while they may again buckle on the armor, it is just as well for others to begin warming up, for new conditions in the yachting game are surely to be met, and it will tax the ingenuity of the best the club can offer to meet them. Power boat racing is fast becoming a fixture in every yacht club and should be encouraged wherever there is the nucleus of a fleet of gasoliners. We had our first experience in this line last season, holding the longest race ever run on fresh water and an international event at that. While there was some dissatisfaction over handicapping, it was in no sense caused by the club, and the race was a success. This year we have scheduled two more and it is only a matter of a short time when races by high power craft will be on the card. Let everybody join in. Owners of schooners, yawls, sloops, power cruisers, auxiliaries, speed boats, dinghies, rowboats, houseboats, launches, anything that floats—get together, steer your craft out into the lake, fall in with the cruises up and down the south shore—make the clubhouse a rendezvous when on shore, watch the butterfly sailors in their dinghies flit around their little triangle,—don't be exclusive, be expansive—it better becomes a sailor, and you will breathe much easier.



T H E Y A C H T S

The racing events this season will be for sailboats, power boats and dinghies. On the cruises to Sodus Bay and Oak Orchard it is hoped that every boat in the club capable of making the trips will accompany the fleet whether it is the intention to race her or not. The season opens on Saturday, May 28th, when the squadron will cruise to Sodus Bay, and closes on Labor Day with a dash from Oak Orchard to Charlotte. The power cruising races will be held on Decoration Day and Labor Day. The new dinghy class will have their races every Saturday afternoon, commencing at 3 o'clock. They will race over a three-mile triangle, crossing and finishing a line drawn in front of the East Side clubhouse.

THE SCHEDULE FOLLOWS :

SATURDAY, MAY 28th—Cruise of the fleet to Sodus Bay.

SUNDAY, MAY 29th—Rendezvous and calls on the Commodore.

MONDAY (Decoration Day)—Cruising race for sailboats to Charlotte. Preparatory gun will be fired from the East Pier at 7:50 a. m. The start will be across an imaginary line drawn from the outer end of the West pier to the outer end of the East pier. The classes will be started as follows :

8:00 A. M.—20-Foot Class

8:30 A. M.—25-Foot Class

9:00 A. M.—30-Foot Class

Time of finish will be taken as yachts cross an imaginary line drawn from the outer end of the West pier to the outer end of East pier. No time limit.

Each yacht shall tow a dinghy over the course. No restrictions as to number of men in crew. In all respects, except as herein stated, the regular racing rules will apply. The Wright Cup will be awarded the winner of the race.

T H E Y A C H T S

All club races for sailboats held on Saturday afternoons will be started as follows :

A red flag will be hoisted if all buoys are to be left to port, and a blue flag if they are to be left to starboard. Should the gun miss fire, the lowering of the flag shall be the signal to start.

In the event of an unfilled class the gun will not be omitted.

The time limit on all club races, excepting cruises, shall be three hours over a six mile course.

If a yacht in any class be the only contestant in her class, and sails fairly around the course, she will be deemed the winner, and as such entitled to a cash prize.

The Nichols Cup will be awarded the winner of the power boat race on Decoration Day. The winner of this race may be challenged by any owner of a power cruiser enrolled in the club, not later than thirty days from the date of the first race, the winner of the second race to hold the cup for the balance of the season.

The second boat to finish in the Decoration Day race will be awarded \$10.00, third \$5.00. The winner in the auxiliary class will be awarded \$10.00.

The William Henry Horton silver cup will be awarded the dinghy making the most points during the season.

POWER BOAT CRUISING RACE SODUS BAY TO CHARLOTTE

Start will be made from an imaginary line drawn from outer end of East pier to outer end of West pier. Preparatory gun will be fired at 10 a. m. The first boat (the one with the largest handicap) will be started at 10:30 a. m. and so on according to the handicaps. No restrictions as to number of men in crew. Each boat shall carry or tow a dinghy over the course. No time limit. The Nichols Cup will be awarded the winner. A special set of instructions and rules will be furnished each captain well in advance of the race.
