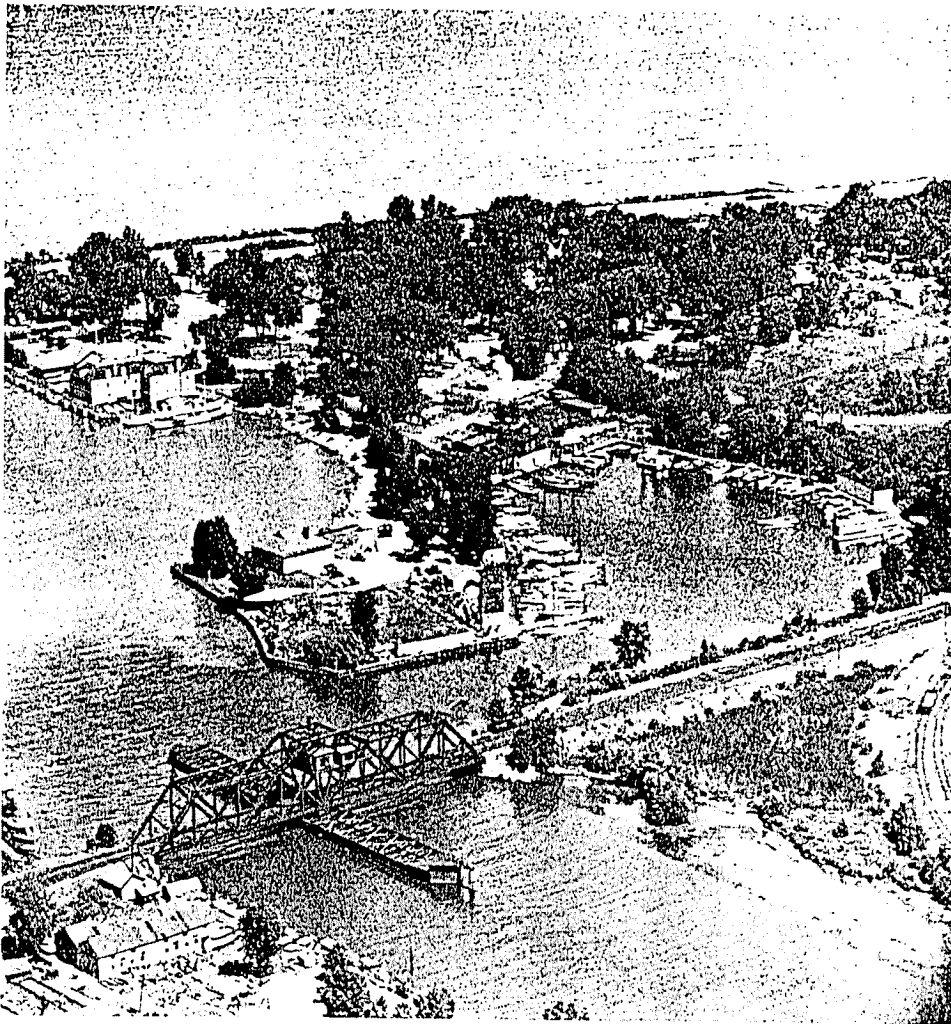

AT HOME AND ABROAD

IN 1936

Never in its history has the R.Y.C. burgee been carried so far and so often as this year, with international engagements extending to Denmark, Scotland, England, and Canada. And when the Rochester sailors were not jousting in foreign lands, they were entertaining visiting skippers off the Summerville jetties.

In between the interclub races the various sailing divisions managed to squeeze in their club championship series, a few "galas" at the clubhouse, in the form of dinners, buffet suppers and dancing and occasionally a purely pleasure cruise.

Not attempting to go into details, the highlights tell the story of an enormously successful season under the resourceful guidance of Commodore Edward J. Doyle and the committee chairmen to whom he gives most of the credit.

The first event of major—almost epochal—importance was the departure for Europe of eight R.Y.C. dinghy sailors, under the captaincy of the ingenious and ingenuous George Ford, admiral of the dinghy fleet. They took with them three of the R.Y.C.—fathered Rochester International "dinks", and returned after two months with a bushel basket of trophies from Denmark, Scotland and England.

Informal races and stunts on Decoration Day and the Fourth of July cruise to Presque Isle, the most unanimously enjoyed event of its kind in the memory of members, started the social season happily.

Then came the George Cup races for Six Meters, with Rochester as the host club and Olcott Yacht Club defending the trophy won by Bill Barrows for the United States in 1935 against the Canadian challengers. After a disastrous first race, Art Harrison's Erne came through handsomely to defeat Canada's Aphrodite in the next two races and to retain the cup for the U.S.A.

The Lake Yacht Racing Association Regatta at Youngstown found R.Y.C. skippers and craft out in force. To the Canadians went the Freeman Cup, for winning the 100-mile distance cruise, and the Gooderham Cup for Eight Metre supremacy. Rochester took the Mabbett Cup, with Karl Bechtold's Cotton Blossom notching top honors in the "R" class in the Freeman race, and Phil Farnham's Kathea II was awarded the Lipton Trophy for her showing in the regatta "R" contests. Subsequently, Phil took the "Kat" to Chicago as Lake Ontario representative in the Richardson races, and brought the coveted mug back to Summerville. Lyman Stuart copping Class "R" honors in the "B" section with "Secret".

The dinghies kept themselves occupied with a triangular meet at Kingston with Kingston and Royal St. Lawrence Yacht Clubs, excursions to Skaneateles Lake and Cooperstown for the Central New York Yacht Racing Association events. Late in the season, George Ford and Bill Tarr tried again to wrest the Emerson Cup from Toronto, but were unsuccessful.

Outstanding in the season's achievements was the organization of a Star fleet here. In a short time, the fleet grew from Bill Nevin's lonely Emmy Lou to a flotilla of nine. Nevin was elected fleet captain after the charter as Lake Ontario Star Fleet (American) was obtained, and Oscar Marth, secretary.

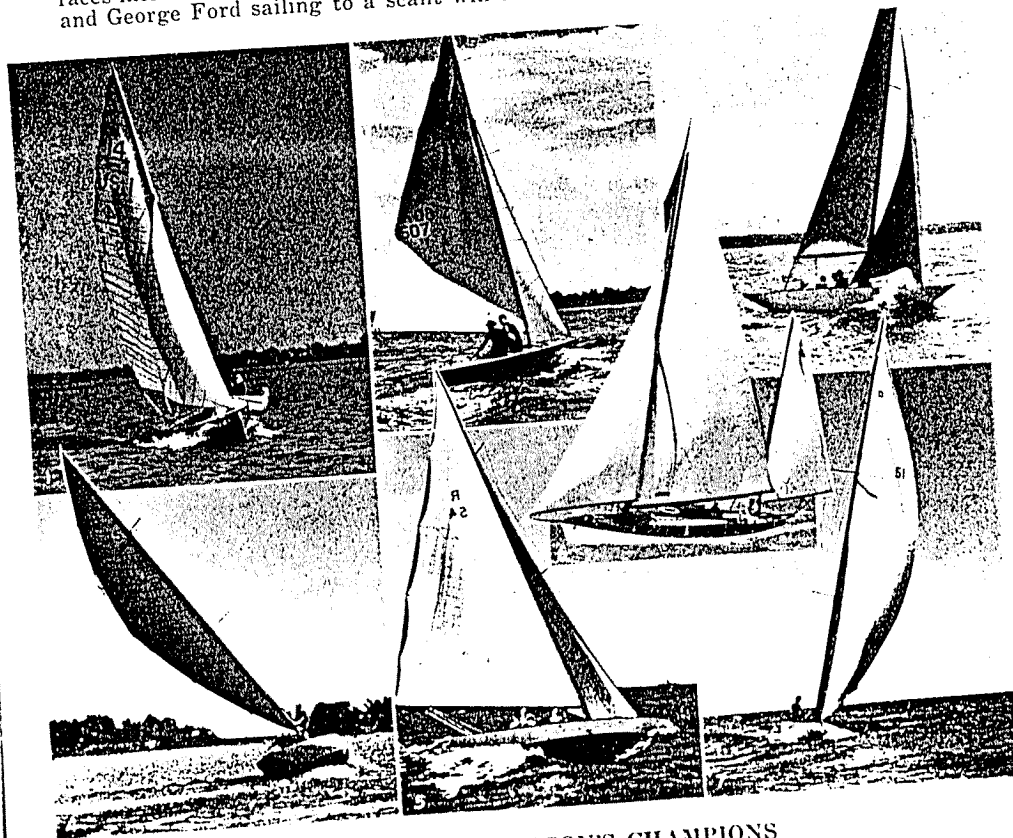
The greatest triumph was the bringing of the International Star Class Yacht Racing Association races to Rochester, with Stars from Europe, Cuba, Hawaii, the Philippine Islands, Canada and all parts of the United States participating in September.

One of the annual classics in yacht racing, the races drew hundreds of visiting spectators to Rochester and gave the Rochester Yacht Club publicity and prestige of international importance.

As chairman of arrangements, Phil Hoffman handled the endless details in such fashion as to win the admiration and praise of all those participating. It was an achievement that required Machiavellian strategy, the tact of a Disraeli, the entertaining aplomb of a Tex Guinan and the patience of Job. Phil came through handsomely in all requirements.

And to these activities must be added the repairing of docks and new lighting in the club basin; the new gravel paving in the yard. It sort of leaves one panting just to look back on all these goings on.

The climaxing of the regular scheduled races at the Club gave John Van Voorhis seasons' championship with Cayuga in the 8 Meter Class taking the Hornbeck trophy. Carl Bechtold annexed the Gannett trophy with Cotton Blossom taking the seasons' championship in the "R" division. Commodore Edward J. Doyle did himself proud by winning the Cole trophy representation of the Star Class Club championship while the dinghy division divided their races into two sections—Championship series won by Ritter Shumway in Gadget and George Ford sailing to a scant win to annex the fall series in R.I.P.

DINGHY DOPE

Officially the Dinghy season opened on Memorial Day with a team race match with the Kingston Yacht Club. For the first time in several years of racing against Kingston, Rochester won the series by taking the first three places in the Saturday race and tying in the Sunday race.

Lured by a very nice cup on the week-end of June 27th and 28th, four of our dinghies went to Irondequoit Bay. The cup was put up for this week-end and was won by "Twerp," skippered by Bill Little with Mike Palmer as crew. On the Fourth of July the "Twerp" and the "Gadget" went to Canandaigua Lake and raced against their fleet of the older type cat-rigged dinghies, including the "Gloriette II." Uffa Fox design sloops are much faster than the older cat-rigged boats. "Gadget" barely nosed out "Twerp" at the finish. These two boats were a leg ahead of the next dinghy.

On the twelfth of August "Gadget", "Eddystone Light" and "R.I.P." went to Cooperstown for the annual regatta of the Central New York Yacht Racing Association. "R.I.P." had three first places, the "Eddystone Light" two seconds and a third, and the "Gadget" had one second, one third, and one withdrawal.

Racing at Kingston on the week-end of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth of August, "R.I.P." and "Token" raced against three Kingston sloops and three English type sloops from Royal St. Lawrence Yacht Club. The first race was sailed in a moderately hard wind. Results:

ROCHESTER DINGHIES INVADE EUROPE

Three boats and eight men sailed from New York on the Manhattan, June the 17th to represent Rochester in the dinghy races in Europe. The first races were at Aalborg, Denmark. The Rochester team finished 1-2-3 in the team races against Denmark. Ed. Pillsbury was high point scorer in this series, taking two firsts and a third.

From Aalborg, Denmark to Oslo, Norway. In Oslo, being guests of the Royal Norwegian Yacht Club, and inasmuch as they did not have any dinghies similar to ours, they suggested that we race a change skipper series with 3 dinghies and two of their 30-ft. Dragons. After three days of hard sailing, Bill Tarr won this series.

From Oslo, to Scotland and arrived just in time to miss the one and only Scotch drought. Of our 14 days in Scotland, it rained 13, although the Scotch called it dew. After sailing two weeks on the Clyde, a person should be in good condition to swim to the North Pole, for there can't be too much difference in the temperature of the waters. In the team races against England, we took a bad beating, but we would have taken the same beating regardless of where we sailed for their sailing was by far superior to ours.

After three days postponement, the Prince of Wales Cup was finally sailed on a day that the wind blew harder than on any of the preceding days when races were postponed. Out of 38 starters, 14 finished. The wind was measured at more than 40 miles an hour from the judge's boat. Ha-Ha did best for the Rochester boats, finishing eighth. Tartar was next, finishing twelfth. R.I.P. was forced to withdraw the first time around.

From Bonnie Scotland (?) we went to Cowes, Isle of Wight, and here we were treated to much better weather and perhaps the most unusual sailing conditions that exist anywhere in the world. The racing here consists of every class attempting to keep out of the way of the other and all racing classes, attempting to dodge liners, motor boats, battleships, and freighters. This series was won by R.I.P. after a sail-off against the Ha-Ha. Regardless of the many handicaps while sailing at Cowes, it was very interesting and we had a fine series.

Most of us returned home on the Queen Mary, arriving at New York on August the 13th.
