# Canada's Cup Solons Named

Two Lake Ontario yachtsmen who raced against each other for the Canada's Cup in 1934, the last time the cup was sailed for, will serve as judges for the 1954 trophy battle which gets underway Monday morning.

They are Rooney Castle of the Rochester Yacht Club and Commodore Thomas K. Wade of the Royal Canadian Yacht Club at Toronto. Twenty years ago Castle, sailing Conewago, was the cup defender for RYC and Wade was the challenger aboard Invader II. Castle won the series by taking three races in a row.

**THEY**, with Alex Winton of the Cleveland Yacht Club, will form the judges committee running next week's races. Setting the buoys for the course of 18 nautical miles will be RYC fleet Captain Earl Esty and Bud Gorsline.

The two Eight Meter yachts involved in the 1954 series are RYC's defender Iskareen, owned by Herb Wahl with Howard Klitgord aboard as skipper and Venture owned by Norm Walsh of the Royal Canadian Yacht Club with Dave Howard as skipper.

In the event a triangular course is set the two boats will sail twice around with each leg of the triangle three miles long. If a windward-leeward course is set, they will sail twice around with each leg four and a half miles long. The judges will decide upon the course to be sailed.

The series will be decided upon a best three of five basis. A race a day will be sailed until one boat wins three races. Starting time for each race is 11 a.m.
